HISTORICAL HIGHLIGHTS

The Book of Revelation addresses seven letters to seven churches in Asia Minor, which is now modern-day Turkey (Revelation 2-3). Each letter, as proclaimed by Jesus and recorded by John the Apostle, declares the triumphs and failings of the recipient churches, and warns each congregation to repent. Jesus through John provided encouragement, warnings, and instructions to churches, urging them to remain faithful.
